

Reflecting

Another season has come and gone for us as skeet shooters and the good 'ole off-season is upon us. It seems that each year that passes it goes by faster and faster. This year was an extremely busy and productive year for me and I hope that it was for you as well. We have had some ups and downs over the last couple of years in skeet shooting with the economy being one of the main drivers. Not knowing what is going to happen may have prevented some shooters and friends from traveling to some tournaments or missing all of them. The big positive event for us to look at is the Mini and Main Worlds this year... The numbers were up!!!! The weather was absolutely perfect for the entire stretch of the Mini and Main and there were a number of great shooters who participated.

Speaking of the World, congratulations to all of the World Champions including Dustin Taylor (28 gauge) and Billy Williams (Champ of Champs) for winning their first World Title. Wayne Mayes won the 12 gauge Title, Craig Parsons took the HAA and the Doubles, Mike Schmidt HOA (perfect 450X450), and Paul Giambrone, III with the 20 gauge and 410 Titles.

This is the time of the year where there will be a number of shooters analyzing their performances over the course of the year and spending some time reflecting on their year. One common mistake for shooters is that they tend to put too much emphasis on the average card. The average card is a good way of looking at your overall "average" in each gauge, but is not a true measure of the shooter you are. I know you are asking yourself how that is possible. I thought the average card was the most useful tool to define myself as a shooter... Not the case, actually quite far from the truth. Instead of looking at the averages for the year and picking out which



shoots were great and which ones were not so great, ask yourself how well did you execute each shot for the year... What do I mean by that? It is simple. All you need to do is analyze the shots you made and see if you did what you wanted to do for that shot. A really good example is a golf shot.

We see the pros after they hit the middle of the green shaking their heads sometimes. Ever wonder why that is? From the outside, it looks like it was a great shot, but here is the bottom line. Most of the time, they made a bad swing or didn't do something right during their swing and they knew it instantly but got away with it. Now, they got away with a bad hit or you can call it a "good miss" but the execution of the shot was off. Meaning just because the end result was good, doesn't mean the shot was executed properly.

Reflecting (Continued)

Same thing can be said about a good shot. They can set up for a putt, hit their line and get the speed they want, but still miss the putt. Those shots are executed perfectly, but the end result is not what they wanted... Now take that same concept and apply it to your skeet shots.

There are times where you make terrible moves or make a poor shot, but yet the target still breaks (these are the "good misses"). However, we tend to focus on the shots that were good shots and executed perfectly, but the target didn't break. These are the shots that drive us crazy as shooters



because we feel we did everything correctly, yet the target didn't break.

When this happens to me, the way I handle the situation is very simple. If I executed the shot the way I wanted to and it didn't break, I can't blame the miss on anything. After all, we are all human! We are going to just miss every now and then for no apparent reason. The key to dealing with this type of miss is to stay focused on the positives and not get caught in the negatives. You must convince yourself that you executed everything perfectly and that it just wasn't meant to be. Well, what about the other misses? When you make a bad move, it is important to realize that no one is perfect, yourself included! More importantly, do not focus on the negatives, but stay focused on the positives. Think about the great move you had to make on the diving Low 6, rather than the perfect Low 3 you missed.... Put the emphasis on the positives the execution on the shot rather than the average card.

What is the one common thing that every clubhouse has in common whether it is at a tournament, league night, or just an every day club? Every clubhouse has the same conversations amongst their shooters. I am not talking about the ones that are about the economy, politics, or the dirty jokes...I am talking about the negative talk that every clubhouse has. The negative talk I am referring to is the one where the shooters want to talk about all of the targets that they missed!!! Everyone wants to talk about why they missed that H2 in the last round or the I2 Low 5s they missed for the weekend! Why would we do that? Realize that it is important to understand why you missed, correct it, and then move on. However, this is rarely the case. Often times we are still talking about targets we missed hours, days and sometimes weeks later or even months later! Shooters do not realize what they are doing here at a sub-conscious level. By talking more and more about the misses, you are feeding your sub-conscious all of your bad moves and therefore that behavior is going to be expected! Instead, spend less time on the negatives things (the misses) and spend more time focusing on the positives (the ones you hit, good misses included). If you start focusing more on the positives, you will gain confidence because that is what you are feeding your conscious mind by talking about it as well as your sub-conscious mind. Overall, be more positive rather than negative!

Tip of the month: I know that we are not going to be spending much time on the skeet field during the off-season, but give it a try over the next couple of times you go to practice. Once the practice is over, talk about all of the good shots you made and executed rather than spending hours of your time on the ones you missed. - Skeet Czar (aka Skeet Chairman, Manager or MIC (Man in Charge) Needed to oversee the management functions of a registered skeet program. Those functions are Planning, Organizing, Staffing and Controlling. Qualified candidates may be male or female. In the event of the later, she would be the Czarina, Manager or FIC (Female in Charge).
- Registrar- Responsible for registering contestants and collecting the appropriate fees and dues. Candidate should be familiar with NSSA Classification systems and shoot management software (if lucky). Candidate needs to be able to do simple math (addition, subtraction and averaging).
- Scheduler Responsible for squadding shooters. Qualified candidates must be a master at coordinating, placating, and diplomacy. A PhD in Psychology would be helpful.
- Referee Must be knowledgeable of the rules of the game of American Skeet, a fast thinker
 and have the ability to take command of the skeet field to which he or she is assigned.
 Candidates should have good eyesight and be physically able to stand in the hot sun for
 hours. Experience dealing with difficult people a plus.
- Scorekeeper The scorekeeper manages the scoreboard, evaluating the results, determining the winners in accordance to NSSA rules and posting those results for all to see.
- Mentor/Coach/Recruiter Encourages, teaches and recruits new shooters to the sport.
- Helper The person selected for this position must be able to help or fill in for any of the individuals listed above on a moments noticed. There are many opening for this position.

Pay – None of these positions pay monetary wages.
